

Instructions for Obtaining an OMMP Card

How to apply and obtain valid OMMP card

The process of obtaining an OMMP Registry Card is very simple. First gather your medical records from your M.D. showing your qualified medical condition with recent follow-up documentation. For these to be acceptable, the process requires at least three documents showing a visit and diagnosis from an M.D. with one or more being within the past 12 months. Renewal applications will review the older documented qualifying condition, with a follow-up documented visit with your M.D. for the same qualified condition. Once all medical records are gathered, you can visit an OMMP clinic. If you don't have your medical records, contact your health care provider and release them to either yourself or directly send them to your chosen OMMP clinic.

Once the appointment is made to visit the clinic, they will tell you which medical records they require. A qualified physician at the clinic will perform a minor physical exam and then determine if he recommends medical marijuana for your condition. The clinic will provide the required state application along with the Physician's statement referral letter for you to mail to the OMMP office.

Submit your application, and the attending Physician's statement from the clinic, to the OMMP office by mail; as well as the payment for the registration fee. Copy the submitted work and the proof of submission to OMMP (date-certified receipt from the Post Office). These copies temporarily act as your legal OMMP paperwork until the state-issued registry card arrives in your mail.

Fees

An OMMP clinic appointment normally costs \$100-\$200. Normal State fee is \$200, being reduced to \$100 for qualified patients of Oregon Health Plan (OHP) and Food Stamps (SNAP). Qualified patients with Supplement Security Income (SSI) is reduced to a \$20 fee. For further information on the clinic fees please contact the clinic or OMMP.

Information

Marijuana is classified as a schedule I drug, meaning it has no accepted medicinal values. In 1998, Oregon voters approved medicinal marijuana in the Medical Marijuana Act. by Oregon voters for marijuana to be a medicine. This does not mean all doctors are willing to write a recommendation, although more doctors seem to be opening clinics to assist patients and the program.

All information is private. We abide by all HIPAA laws as do most clinics, doctors, and OMMP.

To obtain medicine, OMMP requires for you to grow your own medicinal marijuana, have another person grow it for you, or have it donated by another OMMP cardholder. OMMP cardholders can establish relationships in order to obtain desired strains of medicine, donated plants, and grower knowledge.
